Eligibility Information Sheet

Paerangi Project offers accessible learning about how to develop your own short film or web series idea. It is for new and emerging talent living across Aotearoa, and enables you to make screen stories in your own backyard.

The programme is for those interested in developing a short film or web series who have not had the opportunity to learn about filmmaking. This lack of opportunity could be for a variety of reasons, for example, you may be living in a remote region, an isolated situation or face social, economic or accessibility barriers.

Some of these situations could include (but are not limited to):

- You are living regionally/away from main centres where there are few opportunities to learn about filmmaking
- You live rurally away from opportunities to learn about filmmaking
- Your work is demanding and makes it difficult for you to find time to learn about filmmaking
- Your life is occupied by other things that makes it difficult to find time to learn about filmmaking (e.g. you are a full-time caregiver, a full-time parent, you are the kaitiaki your whenua etc)
- You are in a correctional facility (note; if this applies to you, you will only be eligible for Stages One and Two)
- You face economic barriers that have prevented learning about filmmaking
- You feel or are isolated from opportunity to learn about filmmaking
- You have an impairment, disability or condition that makes it difficult to learn about filmmaking through a traditional method
- You lack the confidence to take the first step toward learning about filmmaking
- You have been impacted by COVID-19 which has created barriers learning about filmmaking

Please note: To access the video tutorials you'll need to [register for Stage One](#). You will not be required to disclose the reasons you face a lack of opportunity to learn about filmmaking.

When applying for Stage Two - Mentorship, you will be asked to write a short statement about your lack of opportunity. This is to ensure those who are selected for Stage Two meet the eligibility requirements.
